Background

The new [Working Together 2018](#) requires all children's safeguarding boards to make changes to improve partnership working and the outcomes for children and young people. The new arrangements were implemented on 29th September 2019.

What's changed?

The Local Authority, Clinical Commissioning Groups and Police have now equal and joint responsibility to make arrangements to safeguard and promote the welfare of all children and adults in Warwickshire.

How will Quality assurance work be undertaken?

Quality assurance work will be delivered through the new Quality, Learning and Improvement Hubs, which will be used to provide independent scrutiny and challenge via agency self-evaluations, case file audits, safeguarding reviews, section 11 audits and engagement with professionals and service users.

What's happening in Warwickshire?

Warwickshire Safeguarding Children Board (WSCB) and Warwickshire Safeguarding Adults Board (WSAB) have now been replaced by a single body called **Warwickshire Safeguarding**.

What are the strategic priorities?

Warwickshire Safeguarding's new strategic priorities for 2019-2021 include:

- Effective safeguarding
- Prevention and early help
- Exploitation

What are the new governance arrangements?

The new governance arrangements for Warwickshire Safeguarding include the Safeguarding Executive Board (WSEB), the Safeguarding Children's Partnership Group, the Safeguarding Adults' Partnership Group and four subgroups to drive forward Warwickshire Safeguarding's strategic priorities.
