



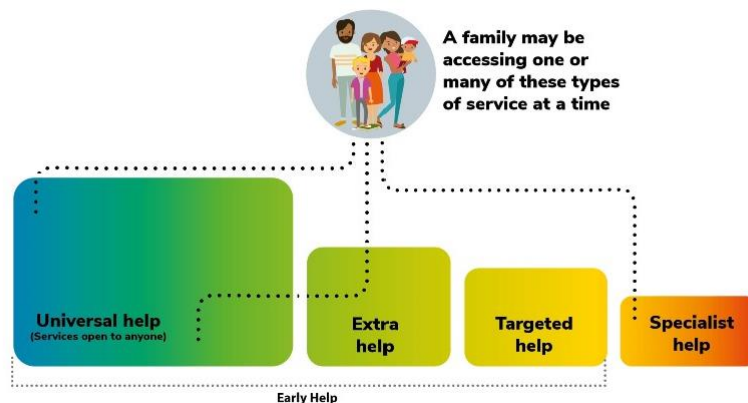
EARLY HELP UPDATES

Dear Colleagues,

As the new academic year is now well underway I thought it would be a useful time to provide you with some Early Help updates. We are eager to ensure as a network, colleagues have all the relevant information to ensure children and families can receive the 'right support at the right time'.

Early Help and Family Support Network:

As part of our ongoing support to practitioner across Warwickshire the team are offering locality Early Help and Family Support Network events.

Early Help Networks are well established events which provide advice, support and guidance to trained Early Help Lead Professionals or partners interested in finding out more about Early Help prior to accessing the training. Sessions are led by locality Targeted Support Officers who share useful information, explore needs in the area and further strengthen the Early Help process to support children and families whilst enabling networking opportunities between organisations.

Family Support Networks are an additional support mechanism for any partner working as a Family Support Worker or Pastoral Lead in their organisation. The sessions aim to share best practice, skills, knowledge and support from partners across the locality and will include restorative solution circles.

Spectrum of Support

The Spectrum of Support was launched over the summer and provides guidance for all practitioners in working together with children and families to provide early help and specialist support. This is Warwickshire's updated threshold guidance as detailed in Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018. It sets out the local criteria for action in a way that is transparent, accessible and easily understood.



The Spectrum of Support references the Early Help Directory which will be launched shortly and will provide details of organisations and support available across the 6 domains of Early Help shown on the triage tool within the Early Help Pathway Assessment and within the Spectrum of Support. More information to follow.

Early Help Social Workers and Locality Discussion Panels:

The team currently have two Early Help Social Workers (a third is currently being recruited), Ettie (Etoile) Lynch and Shar Randall. The Social Workers are Advanced Practitioners, which reflects their experience in the field. Early Help Social Workers can be consulted where the needs of children and families open to Early Help are beginning to escalate or to support families transferring into Early Help from a Social Care intervention.

Where the needs of children and families supported through Early Help are escalating and there are no immediate safeguarding concerns it may be agreed with the consent of the family for the needs to be presented at a Locality Discussion Panel where the circumstances for the family and the interventions provided are discussed and consideration given as to whether a social care children and families assessment may be beneficial. The Early Help Social Workers provide a significant role in presenting families at the panel and need to be consulted as part of this process. Transfer of Early Help Plans:

Just a reminder that all Early Help Pathway Plans should transfer with children and young people as they transition to their new schools or setting to enable the support for the family to continue.
