### **Early Help Ecosystem**

Support services available to children and families in Warwickshire is like an ecosystem. To provide families with the best chance of success, local authority services, commissioned partners, community groups and third sector organisations must work together. Locality-based partnerships are essential for identifying a family's strengths and needs so that the most appropriate help for that family can be identified at the earliest possible time

The Warwickshire approach to grow and maintain our eco system includes,

- Networks
- Education Safeguarding Training
- Collaborative working building capacity, confidence and resilience
- Early Intervention FIS, locality teams, Family Support Workers and Parenting Team
- Transparent systems and accountably from school and early years escalating through early help to the Front Door.
- Graduated response leading to effective escalation and further support from appropriate teams
- Targeted Support Officers
- Early Help Social Workers
- Headteacher coach

### **Networks**

A range of hourly meetings to hear directly from the teams linked to roles on settings. Head teachers, DSL, and Early Help Lead Professional each have the opportunity to continual professional development and enhancing their locality knowledge. Each network adds another layer of knowledge through reflecting on data and feedback from their partner agencies in the locality.

The networks are growing in offering additional support following training. Where settings have attended the nurture training, they can continue to address challenges in implementing the approach and celebrate their success.

### **Education Safeguarding Training**

Education Safeguarding works with Warwickshire schools alongside SEND & Inclusion, Attendance, School Improvement, Governor Services Community Safety and Police. The training is under constant development to reflect National guidance and reviews.

The training offer develops a shared approach to enhance settings operating with safe uncertainty. The training is delivered by those that work in the Early Help and Targeted Support element of the sector. The real experience of working with children and families in the locality is an essential part of the success of the training.

### 2. Newly Qualified Initial Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL)

Each educational setting (School or FE College) should have a minimum of two SLT members who are designated as safeguarding leads (DSL). They will provide support to staff members to carry out their safeguarding duties and who will liaise closely with other services such as Early Help & Children's Social Care. In addition, DSLs can be supported by Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads (DDSLs) as long as they are all trained to the same level as the DSL. DDSLs can be members of staff in other roles. This Initial DSL training should be followed up by ongoing training through the networks and update training every two years (see below).

### 4. Reflective Supervision for Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL)

This is a one-day course for Head Teachers and Designated Safeguarding Leads with at least one year of DSL experience. It is designed to widen your repertoire of options for effective supervisory conversations in respect of safeguarding issues.

### 5. Safer Recruitment (Employment) Training



## Suitable for Early Years and childcare settings / Schools, Colleges and Education providers and School Governors / Proprietors

The Safer Recruitment legislation states that the recruitment and selection of staff should be conducted in a professional, timely and responsive manner and in compliance with current employment legislation, as well as relevant safeguarding legislation and statutory guidance (including KCSiE 2023).

It is vital that as part of their whole school or college approach to safeguarding governing bodies and proprietors create a culture that safeguards and promotes the welfare of children in their school or college. As part of this culture, it is important that they adopt robust recruitment procedures that deter and prevent people who are unsuitable to work with children from applying for or securing employment, or volunteering opportunities in schools and colleges. (KCSIE paragraph 206)

Please ensure that at least one member of your interview panel has undergone this training. There is no timescale for refreshing this training however due to updates in the training we recommend that you consider refreshing at intervals of no more than 3-4 years.

### 6. Prevent Training for DSLs – (FREE)

This FREE 3-hour session (9:30am - 12:30pm) will be jointly delivered by the Warwickshire Prevent Co-ordinator Geoff Thomas who is also available for professional consultation on 01926 412016 or 07428 695020, email geoffthomas@warwickshire.gov.uk.



The session will provide a comprehensive guide to current threat and risks around radicalisation, tailored specifically to assist DSLs address the practical issues surrounding the Prevent Duty. It includes the use of newly developed case studies, drawn from recent local experiences, to deepen understanding of the issues involved in radicalisation and the possible responses to help safeguard children and young people. The session will enable participants to:

- Have an up-to-date understanding of the current and emerging threat and risks within Warwickshire.
- Recognise key signs and symbols linked to extremism, including the risks around the gamification of extremism.
- Build insight into the range of vulnerabilities linked to radicalisation through assuming the role of Channel Panel members to assess real-life case studies.
- Be advised on the latest resources for schools, including the deployment of Prevent training within the school.



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

### 13. Brook Training - Sexual Behaviours Traffic Light Tool

The Traffic Light Tool supports you to:

- Identify behaviour and establish if sexual behaviour is typical or developmentally appropriate, problematic or harmful.
- Understand what that behaviour is communicating and why the child or young person may be exhibiting the behaviour.
- Respond appropriately, considering how the type of response will depend on what's motivating the behaviour, what the behaviour is communicating and the severity of the behaviour.

Warwickshire Children and Families has secured funding for ONE FREE place per school for those working directly with children and applying the tool in practice.

There is an option to buy more places at £30 per person from June 2024. Priority will be given to FREE places to ensure all our schools have the tool to use.


