5.	Refresh of WS Strategic Priorities/Plan		

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Item	Nigel Minns provided WSEB with an update on the Care Review recommendations that are due to come out in Spring. The report is to recommend that each Safeguarding Board throughout the country should have a strategic board and a separate operational group. The strategic board will consist of partners at the highest levels within their organisations who have authority to make decisions. The operational group will deal with the day-to-day responses of safeguarding. These arrangements are due to be piloted prior to implementation. Local areas will be selected to participate in the pilots. Nigel Minns is to share the summary slides provided from the care review. Amrita Sharma provided WSEB with an overview of Warwickshire Safeguarding's 2019-2021 strategic priorities, detailing activities and impact on outcomes.
