Child Sexual Abuse Training

An Introduction to Intra-Familial Child Sexual Abuse – Taking a Multi-Agency Approach

Course Aim and Target Group: This one-day introductory course is designed for professionals who work in collaboration with other agencies, to provide an overview of the key issues to support them in identifying and responding to cases of intra-familial child sexual abuse. It will be delivered by two experts with experience across a multi-agency safeguarding partnership and is CPD-certified as conforming to continuing professional development standards and benchmarks.

Learning outcomes:

- A better understanding of the scale and nature of child sexual abuse
- How the impact of child sexual abuse presents in children and young people
- How children communicate their experiences of sexual abuse and the professional role in helping them do this
- How and why sexual abuse happens in families.
- Greater confidence in identifying and responding to concerns of intra-familial child sexual abuse.
- Improved ability to identify the potential signs and indicators of sexual abuse and sexually abusive behaviour.

Child Sexual Abuse Webinars

Course Aim and Target Group: This programme of webinars led by the CSA Centre has been designed to support the multi-agency workforce by providing clear, accessible insight into the CSA Centre's core practice resources. Each session offers practical guidance, key learning, and evidence-informed principles to help professionals respond effectively to child sexual abuse in their day-to-day roles.

Available to all staff, these webinars build confidence, improve consistency across agencies, and equip practitioners with the tools needed to deliver high-quality, informed safeguarding practice.

Learning Outcomes:

- Increase understanding of the key messages and evidence that underpin the CSA Centre's core practice resources.
- Provide a clear overview of resources, demonstrating how they can be applied effectively in daily professional practice.
- Strengthen confidence and consistency across the multi-agency workforce through informed use of CSA Centre guidance and tools.

West Midlands Children & Young People's SARC Training

Course Aim and Target Group: Join the West Midlands Children and Young People's Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC) for a focused, 45-minute online training session designed for anyone working with children and young people. This session will help professionals feel confident in recognising concerns, understanding referral pathways, and ensuring that children and young people can access the right help at the right time.

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand who the West Midlands Children & Young People's SARC service supports.
- Know the referral pathways and how to access the service.
- Recognise the importance of Strategy Meetings in safeguarding practice.
- Understand the differences between Child Protection (CP) and Child Sexual Abuse (CSA) medicals.
- Be aware of timeframes for collecting forensic (DNA) evidence.
- Know the time-critical medications that can be provided following Child Sexual Abuse.

Contextual Safeguarding: In Practice

Course Aim and Target Group: Contextual Safeguarding challenges the idea that safeguarding is limited to the home. It recognises that young people are influenced by, and vulnerable to harm across a wider range of environments. Delivered by Safer Now, this training helps practitioners understand and apply contextual safeguarding in real-world settings.

Schools, peer groups, neighbourhoods, community spaces, and online platforms all hold the power to protect or expose young people. This approach encourages us to look beyond the individual and family, considering the social, structural, and environmental factors that shape safety.

Available to all professionals working with children and young people, this training provides a clear lens for understanding risk, resilience, and responsibility in the everyday spaces where young people live their lives.

Learning Outcomes:

- Describe the core principles of the Contextual Safeguarding framework and how it expands traditional safeguarding approaches.
- Identify how extra-familial contexts (such as peer networks, schools, community spaces, and digital environments) interact with systemic inequalities, including racism, poverty, and marginalisation to influence risk and resilience in young people's lives.
- Explore practical, collaborative approaches to intervene in extra-familial contexts and co-create safer spaces with young people and communities.

Please note: When registering for this training, attendance at the accompanying Implementation Workshop on 7 October 2026 is mandatory. This workshop is a valuable and practical extension of the learning, giving delegates dedicated time and support to develop an actionable plan for implementing and embedding contextual safeguarding within their own practice and settings.

Recognising & Responding to Neglect

Neglect remains the most common reason children in Warwickshire are the subject of a child protection plan or are placed on a child protection register in the UK. New NSPCC research shows that 83% of professionals across healthcare, police, education and children's social care believe there are not enough services to support children experiencing neglect. We are working together to change this.

Join us for this free, multi-agency webinar to raise awareness around neglect and to showcase new resources and training.

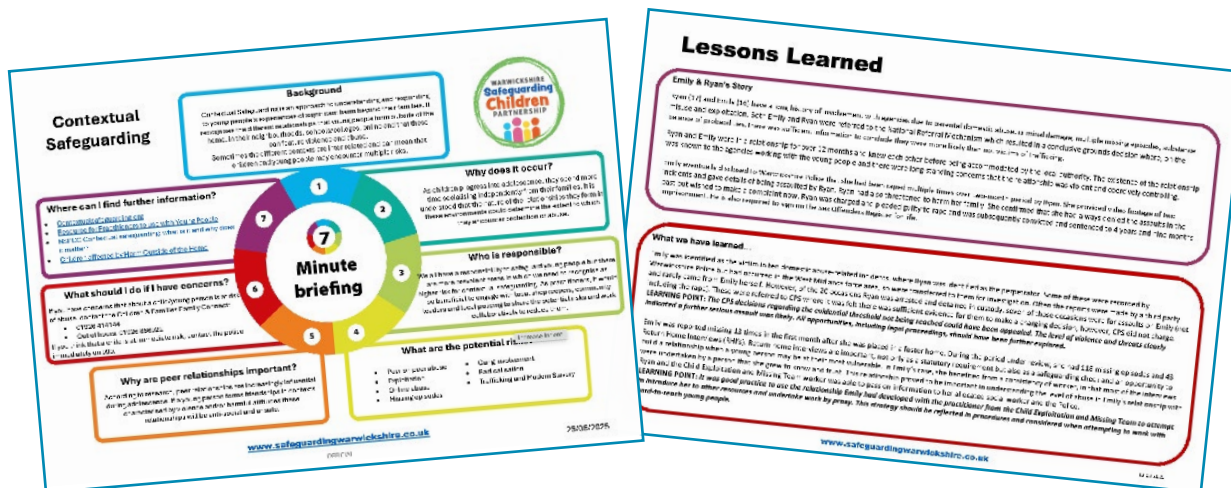
